In support of Ohio's College Credit Plus (CCP) program, Central Ohio Technical College (COTC) agrees to enter a partnership with Coshocton City Schools for academic year 2026/27 for purpose of offering college level coursework to the students of this institution.

As outlined in the CCP legislation, COTC offers the three College Credit Plus models of delivery:

- Embedded HSI (high school instructor): A COTC course is offered at the local school district with a high school teacher credentialed as a COTC adjunct faculty member*.
- Embedded COTC: A COTC course is offered at the local school district with a COTC faculty member.
- On campus/online COTC: Students can take a course at any of COTC's four campuses or online.

*COTC complies with faculty credential guidelines as directed by The Higher Learning Commission and the Ohio Department of Education.

COTC will adhere to the default funding model as prescribed in the College Credit Plus legislation (Section 3333-1-65.6 and 3365.07 of the Ohio Revised Code). This model uses as a basis the K-12 foundation funding as determined annually by the legislature and this funding is split between the college and the school district based on the model of instruction and educational environment. Also in the default model, textbooks are the responsibility of the school district.

Coshocton City Schools will provide any required documents for admission, such as official transcript with unweighted GPA and standardized placement test scores, such as ACT or SAT, if applicable.

COTC will provide support for admissions, testing and registration. COTC and Coshocton City Schools will jointly provide advising for all students interested in enrollment. This will increase students' success by ensuring the best fit possible and communicating policies such as registration, add and drop dates for the 2026/27 calendar year.

This partnership signifies a unified commitment to Ohio's young people and to the future of the state as we work together to prepare an educated and technically trained workforce.
